





A Legendary Links

Founded in 1892, the original layout of the course was the brainchild of Old Tom Morris, four times British Open Champion and the world famous Par 5 "Klondyke" (4th Hole) and the Par 3 "Dell" (5th Hole) are remaining examples of his amazing talents.

1926 saw the arrival of Alister MacKenzie, who was the purist in golf design. MacKenzie strongly believed in keeping a natural appearance to the golf course, creating and shaping holes through the dunes and creating greens with subtle contours and movement, rolling with the natural fall of the land. These values and beliefs are still in place today.

The Old Course (Par 72, 7,050 yards), which provides a stern challenge to even the most gifted golfers and is justifiably proud of its constant standing amongst the World's Top 50 Golf Courses. Each hole offers a different challenge, while the views along the coastline are breath-taking.

The Castle Course (Par 69, 5488 yards) presents golfers with a less formidable, though equally interesting challenge with superb, subtle greens under the watchful eye of Dough Castle.

Lahinch Golf Club is known as St. Andrew's of Ireland due to its location within the village of Lahinch and its world acclaimed golfing heritage and tradition. A warm, welcoming "cÄad mÆle fçilte" and smiles are guaranteed.

This combined with exquisite food served in both the Ocean View restaurant and Trumps's bar all made from locally sourced ingredients makes Doonbeg the ultimate golf destination. 

The words 'Alister Mackenzie' will prove sufficient to lure golfers from around the world, such is the esteem in which this British golf architect is held. Cork Golf Club is rightly proud of the work he carried out there, on Little Island, in the 1920's.

The course has a beautiful old school charm to it and combines the beauty of holes clinging to the water of Cork Harbour (4-6), parkland holes flowing through the trees and the famous limestone quarry holes.

Recent work has seen the bunkers returned to more traditional Mackenzie shapes and they are raised up, attractive and very threatening. It was a brave move by the club, but one that has proved a triumph.

This mature setting mixes the variety of holes to perfection. It keeps the adrenaline flowing, especially with a couple of sharp, unexpected elevation changes at the end of the round. Be sure to look out for Seve's Tree, a Spanish Chestnut planted in 1983 to celebrate the legend's 332 metre drive on the 11th hole







To ensure a successful and enjoyable trip, it is advisable to book well in advance. It is not unusual for visiting golfers to book 12 months in advance.



The main season runs from April to October but golf can be played all year round, weather and course conditions permitting. September is the busiest month for golf.



Always plan and book golf tee times before finalising accommodation and transportation reservations.



When planning your trip use our map and driving time grid on pages 4/5 to assist you, as driving time is more important than distance in Ireland.



There are more tee times available on the weekdays than the weekends.



If hiring a vehicle, always ensure it is large enough to carry golf clubs and luggage. For example, with groups of 4-6 golfers our recommendation is a minivan.



A chauffeur driven coach is a good option for groups of 8 or more. Your chauffeur will coordinate your travel plans and daily activities, ensuring comfort and relaxation during your stay.



Do request caddies in advance. In general senior caddies will carry two bags (double). It is advisable to take a least one caddy per fourball.



While Ireland's summer climate is temperate and pleasant, it is advisable to bring wet gear and also pack a few sweaters for the evenings.



Always take out travel insurance.
